Challenge:

Central Virginia Family Practitioners needed help extracting data from their EHR to meet NCQA Patient Centered Medical Home (PCMH) requirements.

Central Virginia Family Physicians (CVFP), a private group practice with eight primary care offices and two urgent care centers, had a bold vision. In doing so, they could deliver better, more coordinated care for patients by collaborating with other provider organizations in their area.

Though, they first needed to standardize workflows across the entire practice
